This year, we welcomed four new students: Isabel, Tere, Rosario and Mariel. With their arrival, we strengthen our commitment to guiding these young women toward a future full of possibilities.

In 2023, our students actively participated in more than 1,500 hours of human development workshops, received more than 2,300 hours of individual academic advice and attended more than 20,000 hours of university classes and 1,000 hours of English classes. This significant impact would not be possible without the invaluable support of each of our generous donors and more than 50 professional volunteers who enthusiastically joined our cause.



Success case: Mayra

Before joining The Gibson Soto Foundation, my life occurred on the rural ranch of Santiaguillo in Guanajuato. I was born in a humble family where my father is a farmer and my mother is a housewife. Our income was always below the poverty line, which made my dreams of going to college seem unattainable. But that didn't stop me.

Studying in Santiaguillo is a challenge, since the schools are far from the communities and there is no transportation for students. Walking long distances is an everyday reality, and many young people are forced to abandon their studies. For 6 years I walked 2 hours there and 2 hours back to go to middle school and high school, crossing streams and rivers. Furthermore, economic opportunities are scarce, and cultural norms influence our future.

Since I was little, one of my biggest dreams was to attend college and obtain a degree in a profession I was passionate about. However, financial expenses and the lack of a safe place to continue my studies were obstacles that seemed insurmountable. Despite the difficulties, I was determined to break the cycle of poverty in my family and become the first in my family to have a college degree.

Everything changed when I met The Gibson Soto Foundation, a place that allowed me to continue my studies and guaranteed peace of mind for my family, knowing that I would be in a safe and supportive environment. For four and a half years, I lived at La Cima, and my life took an incredible turn.

The Gibson Soto Foundation human development program has been a true blessing in my life. Thanks to their support and dedication, I have learned to overcome my fears and face challenges with courage. The workshops and classes they offer have given me the tools necessary to try new things and expand my horizons. Additionally, living in a community with other students has allowed me to learn to share life with people from different experiences and cultures, enriching my perspective and teaching me to value diversity. Thanks to The Gibson Soto Foundation, I have developed greater self-confidence and am ready to continue exploring a future full of possibilities.





Success case: Lupita

Before entering The Gibson Soto Foundation, I did not have the financial means to continue studying. I continued paying for private piano lessons once a week, while I worked giving a few piano lessons a week, with which I paid for my classes. I rented a room shared with a friend in Querétaro, while my family was far away, and they supported me financially with what little they could. My diet was poor; I regularly ate a tamale for breakfast in the morning as it was the most economical, and lunch was a sub or something I could take to work. I found myself with a feeling of uncertainty about the future, especially about how I would continue studying.

My life was transformed by being part of The Gibson Soto Foundation. I could continue my career in a school specializing in classical music, with the necessary instrument to continue my career- an upright piano which The Gibson Soto Foundation provided me to practice with. My diet improved with nutritious meals three times a day, plus snacks, and I could concentrate on my studies.

I found a balance in my life psychologically and emotionally by having human development courses with Daiysi, Janet, several speakers, and semiology of daily life with Yéssica. In therapy with Janet, I was able to learn more about why I acted in certain ways, and change habits or attitudes that did not help me advance in my personal growth, and create new habits. These specialists also helped me feel more secure with myself and to understand that people have the best reasons for being the way they are, which further developed my empathy and tolerance towards others, and most importantly toward myself.

I acquired new skills in my piano tutoring classes with Oliver, who taught me how to improvise in popular music pieces. I'm grateful for my English teachers Jim, Fernando, and Noe, the social service guys Bruno and Rodrigo, and the volunteers like Robyn, who always inspired me to improve myself and overcome my fears, helped me resolve doubts, improve my pronunciation, and made me feel safe to speak in English with other people.



Now that I have finished my degree, I envision a better future, living a dignified life that provides beyond my basic needs, being independent, supporting my family financially with a well-paid job, and also being an emotional support for them thanks to my new perspective on life. Because I now understand that we all can give to and transform other people's lives, I would like to support others, such as students, family, and people in my community.

I see myself having more and more success and opportunities in my career as I gain more knowledge, and I would like to give concerts in various parts of the country to promote my culture or support altruistic causes. Being a music teacher allows me to provide quality education regardless of the social sector to which people belong. I really want to continue learning, and preparing myself with diplomas or a master's degree in areas common to my career to continue improving. And I want to have a command of the English language that provides me new learning opportunities and jobs. I hope that the great friendships and support ties that I made in my time at The Gibson Soto Foundation will continue to grow.



Nutrition program for our students

During 2023, we continued to strengthen our nutrition program at The Gibson Soto Foundation with a comprehensive approach. Our students benefited from a carefully designed program, which included individual assessment of nutritional status.

Students from the UAQ Bachelor's Degree in Nutrition carried out this process, providing personalized recommendations to guarantee adequate nutrition. In addition, balanced menus were implemented, considering the specific nutritional needs of each student. To optimize food handling practices, staff were trained in best practices, from receiving, to storage, and food preparation. This comprehensive approach to the nutrition of our students is an essential component of our commitment to their well-being and integral development.





Community projects

At The Gibson Soto Foundation, we believe that true transformation goes beyond the classrooms. That is why we have developed a community projects program that empowers our students to be agents of change in their communities. Each student chooses a specific problem in their local community and works on designing and implementing a project that addresses that need. This initiative not only allows them to apply their academic knowledge but also encourages leadership, social responsibility, and a sense of belonging. Through these projects, our students not only grow as professionals, but also contribute significantly to the well-being of their communities, generating a sustainable and lasting impact.

This year, 7 of our students participated in a 6-month training to choose and design a project that will positively impact their community. These projects will be implemented next year.





Community projects

María José Winter educational course "Exploring mathematical learning"

Objective: For 80% of the girls and boys in fifth and sixth grade in the El Pie, Querétaro community to develop the mathematical skills necessary to achieve their educational and personal goals that will be useful for their entire lives.

Evelyn Local Garden "Rinconcito del sol"

Objective: To Promote the economic independence of the women in my community by providing the necessary tools so that they learn to cultivate a home garden with medicinal herbs, and develop products like soap, body cream, etc.

Daniela Summer course "Let's learn to eat"

Objective: Teach the population of Palo Blanco, Arroyo Seco about local and low-cost healthy nutritional meals, thus improving their general health to achieve a better quality of life.

Dalia English classes "Let's learn together"

Objective: To teach basic English to 15 boys and girls ages 5 to 9 from the town of San Sebastián, Tenochtitlan in 12 sessions over 3 months opening new opportunities for them



Community projects

Jessica Basic English classes for boys and girls. "My first step to English"

Objective: To generate better opportunities through basic English vocabulary classes for boys and girls ages 8 to 12 in my community.

Ana María Workshop for girls and boys, "Animal welfare"

Objective: To generate awareness among children, young people and adults in the community of La Torre, Amealco, about animal welfare, being responsible, and create awareness that we are all living beings who feel and inhabit the same space.

Dulce Summer course "English classes"

Objective: That the boys and girls of the Sabino community learn basic English language (alphabet, numbers, family and colors), through dynamic and fun classes, to have better educational and work opportunities.
